INFUSION CENTER TREATMENT

UNDERSTANDING YOUR COVERAGE:

Before attending your first scheduled appointment, confirm and understand any out-of-pocket costs with your site of care.

If applicable, provide your copay card or financial assistance information to your site of care.

PREPARING FOR YOUR FIRST TREATMENT:

Be on the lookout for calls, texts, or emails from your infusion provider or healthcare provider (HCP) to confirm your appointment.

Locate your infusion site and plan how you will get there. It may be helpful to take into account traffic and parking.

If you cannot drive yourself, ask a caregiver, family member, or friend to help you get to infusion appointments.

Talk to your HCP about how to prepare for your infusion appointment. You could ask during a visit with your HCP, call their office, or reach out to them through your HCP's patient portal. Your HCP may have suggestions for things you can do to prepare, including:

What to wear to be comfortable during the infusion process. (example: stretchy or loose clothing)

What extra time you may need before and after your infusion.

Bringing a list of your medications and vaccinations.

Reviewing your ONWARD Welcome Kit and any preparation protocols your infusion provider recommends.









INFUSION CENTER TREATMENT

Pack an infusion appointment bag.

Think about what you can do to stay entertained during the infusion process and the observation period following each infusion. Consider what you'd like to do to pass the time (read, solve puzzles, play games on your phone, listen to some music, or watch a TV show/movie you downloaded ahead of time).

Add to your bag anything that might make you more comfortable, like a light blanket in case it's chilly, or a water bottle or snacks.

Coordinate with your site of care to schedule all six infusion appointments and add them to your calendar for easy reference.

UNDERSTANDING YOUR COVERAGE:

If applicable, provide your copay card or financial assistance information to the Specialty Pharmacy and Home Infusion Agency.

PREPARING FOR YOUR FIRST TREATMENT:

Talk to your HCP about how to prepare for your infusion appointment. You could ask during a visit with your HCP, call their office, or reach out to them through your HCP's patient portal. Your HCP may have suggestions for things you can do to prepare.



Your OCC will be reaching out during your treatment cycle to check in. We are always here to listen to you about how things are going!

Review your ONWARD Welcome Kit and any other materials your HCP gave you regarding your treatment.

Pharmacy will contact you and set up your shipment supplies/product.

Go over storage with the pharmacy prior to first infusion.

Identify a designated space in your home to store supplies and product.

At-Home Infusion coordinator will call to set up an appointment for a nurse to administer the product.

Coordinate with your infusion nurse or coordinator to schedule all six appointments for your infusion cycle. Add them to your calendar for easy reference.

Wear comfortable clothing during the infusion process. (example: stretchy or loose clothing)

AFTER YOUR FIRST TREATMENT:

Your HCP and infusion team will let you know what to monitor following your infusions. If you have any concerns after treatment, follow the instructions provided or reach out to your HCP.
